Due to the continued success and popularity of our *Youth Hunter Education Camps*, we are offering four camps this summer. All camps will offer the same courses and certifications. Register for the one that best suits your schedule. The camp is open to all boys and girls age 12 to 17 (due to Federal firearms regulations, all participants must be a minimum of 12 years of age to qualify to attend the camp).

The *Youth Hunter Education Camp* is a five-day event of fun-filled learning activities. Financial support has been provided by *Wildlife Habitat Canada*. Experts will be sharing their knowledge and providing instruction in the *Alberta Conservation and Hunter Education Program*, the *Canadian Firearms Safety Program*, and much more.

Please note:

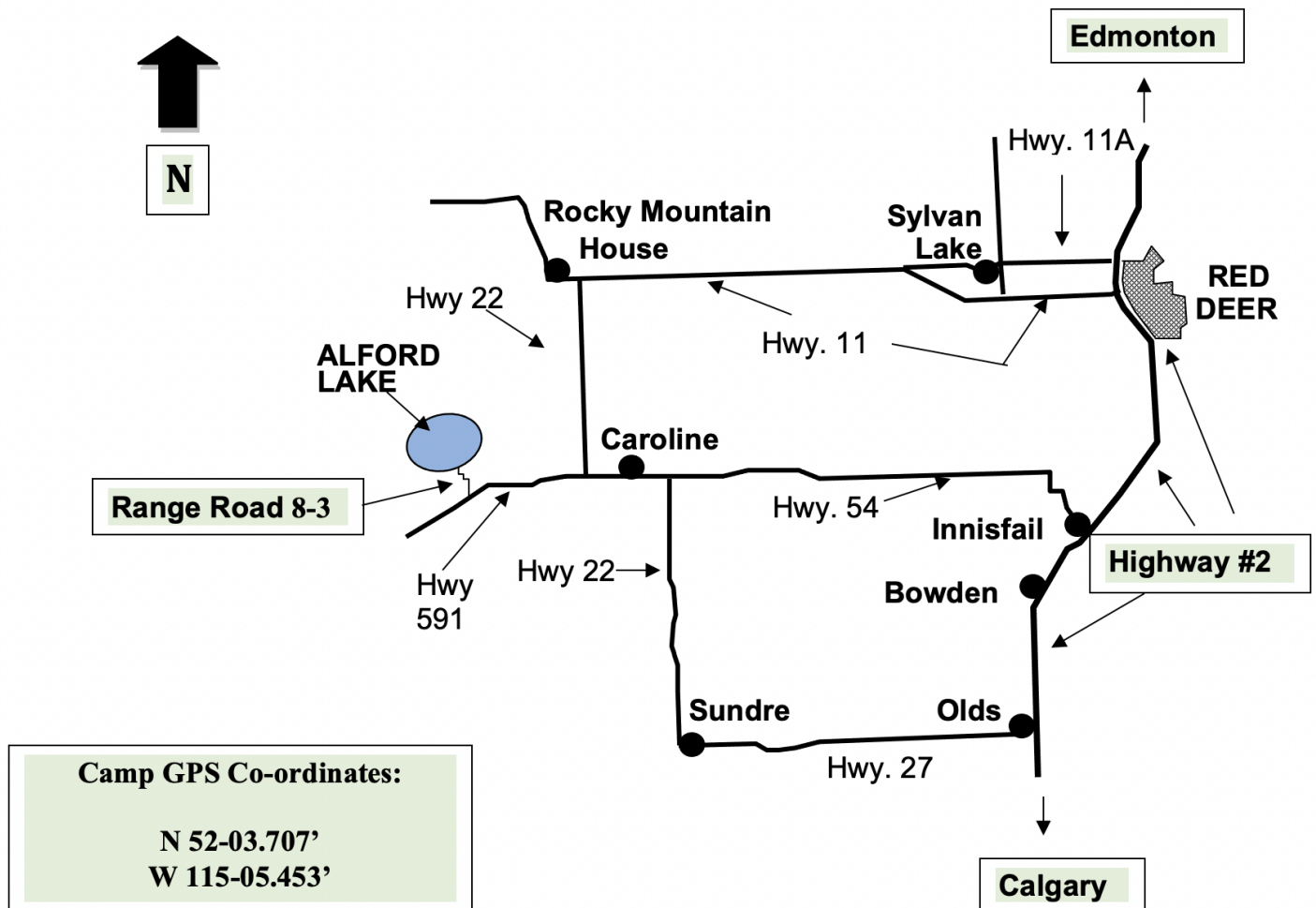
- * The cost per participant is \$440.00 (plus GST) and includes meals, lodging, instruction, testing, and all materials including an AHEIA t-shirt.
- * Registration must be made online at www.aheia.com/events. Registration is complete only after payment has been made. A receipt and more information will be sent to successful registrants.
- * Campers are required to arrive and check-in between 4:00 pm and 6:00 pm on Sunday. Late check-ins will not be accepted unless previous arrangements have been made.
- * Campers will be ready for pick-up following a graduation ceremony at 12:00 noon on Friday. Parents are invited to attend the graduation ceremony and take pictures, etc.
- * Following successful testing, camp participants will be certified in the Alberta Conservation and Hunter Education Program and the Canadian Firearms Safety Program (Minor's permit only).
- * Dietary restrictions can be accommodated in most (but not all) cases. This can be discussed with AHEIA prior to camp.
- * Campers will be staying in cabins with adult supervision. Volunteers are required as cabin supervisors.

Volunteers Needed

- * AHEIA requires volunteers in order to make our programs a success. Parents or caregivers are encouraged to attend camp with their campers. Consider attending with your child and help out with cabin monitoring, instruction (for those who are qualified) or minor maintenance around camp. All meals and accommodations are provided for volunteers. If there is room, interested volunteers can take the Hunter Education and/or Firearms Safety courses at a nominal fee.
- * Please indicate on your child's online registration form if you would like to volunteer. Priority will be given to those campers whose parents/caregivers volunteer to assist at camp.
