We are very happy to be offering our full slate of competitive shoots this year and numerous non-registered trap and skeet shooting events. It is also our honour to once again be hosting the ATA Provincial Trapshooting Championships, July 17-20, 2025, and we extend a very special welcome to visiting shooters travelling from Canada and USA for the event. Pre-squadding for the competition will be available at presqad.com. All 2025 shoot dates are listed in this program, or you can find them on our website, aheia.com/calgary-firearms-centre.

The AHEIA Calgary Firearms Centre is a recreational claybird shooting facility which offers trap, skeet, and 5stand to shooters of all levels and abilities, year-round. We are very excited to announce that we now have a sporting clays
course for visitors to enjoy during our summer season. Please see our website for more information and times when the
sporting clays field, and our facility, will be open. If you are interested in trying the shooting sports, you are welcome to book
a free session with one of our experienced coaches who will introduce you to target shooting. We provide rental shotguns,
and ammunition is available for purchase. If you do not have a Possession & Acquisition Licence (PAL), you must be
accompanied by someone who does, other than during a coaching session, in order to shoot at the Calgary Firearms Centre.
If you are interested in pursuing clay target shooting, we highly recommend you take a Canadian Firearms Safety Course so
that you can apply for your PAL. There are many instructors throughout the province who offer the course, or you can take it
at one of our facilities in Calgary and Edmonton, as well as at the Calgary Firearms Centre. If you are interested in an AHEIA
Firearms Safety Course, register your name on our notification list through our website and you will receive an email when
new course dates are available.

Our popular Women's & Youth Shotgun Leagues will be offering spring and fall sessions again this year on Wednesday evenings, beginning in May. Joining a league is a fantastic way for new shooters to become confident with shooting and those experienced in the sport to sharpen their shooting skills, all in a controlled and safe environment under the supervision of our experienced coaches. In September, National Trap Day is a great opportunity for those who wish to take the next step in target shooting by participating in a one-day competitive registered shoot.

The Calgary Firearms Centre also has a 70 yard outdoor archery range which is available during the centre's hours of operation, and we offer a family archery league for those interested in this sport. The archery league is a lot of fun for all ages! If you are curious about the league, come to an Introduction to Archery event on April 30, 2025, at 4:30pm.



GENERAL INFORMATION

GENERAL INFORMATION			
Prices	All services at the Calgary Firearms Centre are subject to GST. Prices listed in this Program do not include GST. <i>Target prices are subject to change without notice in the event of an increase in the price of targets to the club.</i>		
Shells	Reloads will be permitted at all tournaments. A limited number of factory loaded shells will be available at prevailing prices. A valid firearms licence (PAL) is required to purchase shells at the Calgary Firearms Centre.		
Camping	A limited number of camping spaces are available at \$10.00 per night. Power and water are available at \$15 per night, but the number of spaces with this service is limited. Washrooms and showers in the clubhouse will be open on shoot days. Campers please report to the Cashier's Desk. All campsite bookings should be made through cfc@aheia.com or calling the Calgary Firearms Center at 403-256-0665.		
Practice Traps	Practice traps will be open during shoots. Practice rounds will be at regular Calgary Firearms Centre rates.		
Shoot-offs	All ties will be shot-off or carried over at the discretion of shoot management. Shooters are responsible for determining whether they are in a shoot-off and for reporting to the shoot-off when called. Shooters who fail to report timely will forfeit.		
Junior Shooters	Junior and Sub-Junior shooters will be exempt from target and trophy fees <i>provided that they do not play any purse or option in any event</i> . Junior and Sub-Junior shooters must pay ATA Day Fees and APTA Fees where applicable.		
Straight Pins	The Calgary Firearms Centre will award 100 Straight Pins to shooters scoring 100 in any event or sub-event of that length and 200 Straight Pins to shooters scoring 200 in an event of that length.		
House Guns	The Calgary Firearms Centre has a limited number of shotguns available for use by shooters. To use guns without direct supervision of Calgary Firearms Centre personnel, the user must have a valid firearms license (PAL). Please check with the Cashier for rates.		
Alcohol	Alcohol is restricted to camp shelters or camping areas. Shooters are reminded of ATA rules that prohibit consumption of alcohol or drugs during participation in any event or subevent or between events or sub-events, including practice, shoot-offs, checking in for shoot-offs, and referees.		
Trophies	Shoot management reserves the right to amend the trophy schedule for any shoot. If changes are made, they will be posted prior to beginning of the first event of the shoot.		

CLASSIFICATION

Classification will be based on official averages and known ability. In all cases, known ability will have a strong bearing on classification. Shoot management reserves the authority to change the classification of any shooter at any time and the additional authority through proper channels with the ATA to make any yardage change they deem necessary.

Shooters are required to have their 16-yard and doubles averages computed prior to registration. Shooters who present an average card without all targets recorded and/or without averages being calculated *will not be classified until the card is completed*.

The following classification table will be used as a basis for all shoots *other than the Provincial Championships and the Western Zone*

NOTICE TO SPECIAL CLASSIFICATION SHOOTERS

Lady I, Lady II, Veteran, Senior Veteran, Sub Veteran, Junior, Junior Gold and Sub-Junior shooters must declare themselves at the time of classification in order to be eligible for special category trophies, if available. It is the responsibility of special category shooters to ensure that their special category has been noted on their entry form prior to cashiering for the first event entered.

HANDICAPPING

A shooter will shoot his or her ATA or PITA yardage, whichever is the longest. However, if the shooter has not shot PITA targets in the current or preceding ATA target year and has been granted a reduction after an ATA 1,000 target review, the shooter will shoot from his or her ATA yardage.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

All tournaments will be governed by the rules of the Amateur Trapshooting Association. Every person who enters a competition agrees to abide by the rules of the Amateur Trapshooting Association *and* the terms of this Program *and* to accept all decisions of shoot management.

PURSES AND OPTIONS

There are no compulsory purses in these tournaments. You may shoot for targets and trophies only or play any purses or options in the program.

purse divided 50%/30%/20% - percentage system.

purse divided 60%/40% - percentage system.

50/50 Club Pots 50/50 Club Pots are made up of three separate 50

straight purses in any 100 target *handicap* event. The first and second 25 target sub-events constitute the first 50, the second and third 25 target sub-events constitute the second 50, and the third and fourth 25 target sub-events constitute the third 50. Entry fee is \$9.00, of which \$3.00 will be added to each purse. Any shooter who plays the 50/50 Club Pots and breaks all of the targets in any 50 will receive 50% of the purse for that 50. If more than one shooter breaks all of the targets in any 50, they will divide the 50%. Club Pots are progressive and will be carried over from one handicap event to the next, from one shoot to the next and from one year to the next. Entry fees paid at a shoot are added to pots after payoffs are

calculated for the shoot.

Special Event Proceeds of all bids (less 10% retained by the Club as an

administration fee) and shooter entry fee of \$10.00, form the purse. Purse will be divided into one money per seven shooters entered (rounded to the nearest seven) –

hi-gun system. Shooter 25%, buyer 75%.

SAFETY

- The practice of tracking targets behind a shooting squad is unsafe, disconcerting to the shooters, and is not permitted.
- A gun, which for any reason fails to fire as intended, must be promptly
 opened without any subsequent determination by the referee/scorer of
 the cause of the failure to fire.
- Test shots will not be permitted under any circumstance.
- All guns must have the action opened and contain no live or empty shells at any time, except while the shooter is on the firing line. A break open gun may be closed when it is in a gun rack but it shall not contain a live or empty shell. A gun other than a break open gun must have the action open when in it is in a gun rack and it shall not contain a live or empty shell.
- A shooter may place a live shell in his gun only when on a post facing the traps. In singles or handicap a shooter may place only one shell at a time in his gun. In Doubles a contestant may place two shells at a time in his gun. All live and empty shells must be removed from the gun before moving from one post to another. Snap caps or recoil reduction devices may be excluded from the foregoing only if colored a safety orange so as to permanently identify them as not being a live or empty shell. In changing from one post to another, it is highly recommended the shooter not walk in front of other shooters.
- A shooter must not in any manner interfere with the preceding shooter by raising his/her gun to point or otherwise create an observable distraction.
- Shooter are not permitted to shoot while seated in or otherwise using a
 golf cart on the firing line. Single passenger conveyances are the
 appropriate means for participating should one require assistance due to
 permanent or temporary disability.
- All guns must be equipped, fitted and used so as not to eject empty shells in a manner that substantially disturbs or interferes with other contestants.
- If a flag, orange pylon or stop sign appears on the trap-house, immediately unload your gun and wait until it is removed, indicating ready.
- Do not place your hand or any other part of your body over the muzzle of your gun. The practice of resting the muzzle of a shotgun on a shooter's toe is discouraged.
- Do not point your gun in the direction of any person even though you know the gun is not loaded.
- Only target loads conforming to ATA specifications may be used.
- Each shooter must have his own gun while on the firing line. The practice
 of sharing a gun on the firing line is dangerous and will not be allowed.

- Protective shooting glasses and ear protection must be worn.
- All empty hulls that hit the ground are the property of the Club.
- All adjustments of the trap machines will be done by authorized personnel only.
- All loading of trap machines will be done by authorized personnel only.
- The Calgary Firearms Centre reserves the right to refuse shooting privileges to any individual possessing faulty firearms and/or ammunition.
 The Calgary Firearms Centre also reserves the right to expel any individual who, in the opinion of shoot management, disrupts the harmony of a tournament.
- The Calgary Firearms Centre assumes no responsibility for injuries or damages resulting from the use of firearms. The Calgary Firearms Centre assumes no responsibility for the use of faulty firearms or ammunition.
- The Calgary Firearms Centre reserves the right to refuse shooting privileges to individuals who, in the opinion of shoot management, are not in a mental or physical condition to handle a firearm.






No Shoot-offs or carry-overs in the Wednesday Doubles Events. Singles and Doubles Ties and carry-overs will carryover to the next like sub-event until resolution is required by shoot-off. Handicap ties in the Western Zone Friday Handicap will be Shot-off. All other Handicap Ties will be carried over to the next like event unless a tving shooter earns vardage, in which case all tying shooters must agree to the carry-over. Shoot-offs will be based on 25 targets for Singles and Handicap; 10 pair for Doubles; 20 Singles, 10 Handicap and 5 pair Doubles for HAA; and, 20 Singles, 20 Handicap and 5 pair Doubles for HOA events. Carry-overs will be based on 25 target sub-events for Singles and Handicap and 50 target subevents for Doubles. 100 or 200 Straights in Championship Events will immediately bank targets in 25 or 10 pair subevents and repeated as necessary. Shooters are responsible for determining whether they are in a shoot-off and to report to the shoot-off when called. Shooters who fail to report timely will forfeit. Check zone scores to determine when you are in a zone shoot-off.

Junior and Sub-Junior shooters will be exempt from target and trophy fees *provided that they do not play any purse or option in any event*. Junior and Sub-Junior shooters must pay ATA Day Fees and APTA Fees.

Straight Pins The APTA and the Calgary Firearms Centre will award 100 Straight Pins to shooters scoring 100 in any event or sub-event

of that length and 200 Straight Pins to shooters scoring 200 in

an event of that length.

House Guns The Calgary Firearms Centre has a limited number of shotguns available for use by shooters. To use guns the user must have a valid firearms license (PAL). Please check with

Targets

Make-up A squad may be held up to five minutes for a tardy shooter. If

the tardy shooter does not appear within five minutes, the squad must begin the event without that shooter. Per ATA Rules, if the tardy shooter arrives before the squad fires the first shot on the second post of the first sub-event, the shooter may make-up the first post only and continue with the squad. A shooter will not be allowed to make-up more than 50 targets on the make-up traps. If a tardy shooter is unable to join the squad before the squad has started their third sub-event, the shooter must re-squad for the event. The host club may in its discretion charge a re-squad penalty not exceeding \$25. A shooter will not be permitted to re-squad on a short squad that has commenced the event. All make-ups must be completed

by the time the last squad completes the event.

Class Advances

Shooters winning or tying for class in any Singles or Doubles events (including at the discretion of the handicap committee, any Preliminary events that are not included in the HOA) will advance at least one class for the next like event.

Handicapping

A shooter will shoot his or her ATA or PITA yardage, whichever is the longest. However, if the shooter has not shot PITA targets in the current or preceding ATA target year and has been granted a reduction after an ATA 1,000 target review, the shooter will shoot from his or her ATA yardage.

Shooters 70 years of age or older who have less than 1,000 total handicap targets registered for the current and previous two years will shoot from assigned yardage or average card yardage, whichever is longer. Assigned yardage for these shooters will be no less than 20 yards.

All other shooters who have less than 1,000 total Handicap targets registered for the current and previous two years will shoot from assigned yardage or average card yardage, whichever is the longer. Assigned yardage for these shooters will be no less than 23 yards.

At the discretion of the the handicap committee, a shooter's yardage may be reassigned if target minimums are met during the tournament, subject to restrictions.

Should you earn yardage in any Handicap event, it is the shooters responsibility to report to an Event Coordinator for yardage punch and any possible squadding revisions resulting in movement.

The Alberta Provincial Championships/Western Zone NOTICE TO SPECIAL CATEGORY SHOOTERS

Because All American points will be awarded at this tournament, **shooters may declare only one special category** (i.e. Lady I, Lady II, Sub-Junior, Junior, Junior Gold, Sub Veteran, Veteran, or Senior Veteran). Chair shooters are exempt from this rule. Shooters must declare their special category at the time of classification in order to be eligible for special category trophies. It is the responsibility of special category shooters to ensure that their special category has been noted on their entry form prior to cashiering for the first event entered.

TROPHY PROCEDURE

A Category Shooter tied for Closed event Champion may shoot-off for the Championship Trophy. If the Category shooter fails in the trophy shoot-off they will fall back to the declared Category. Closed Runner-up and Closed Category winners may not fall back to Open Champion. All other qualifying closed Category shooters may fall back in the following order: Open Champion, Closed Class, Open Class. In an event that has no Champion Trophy, the Category shooter whose score qualifies for a trophy in their declared Category, may not fall back to place, or class. Where there is no Category Trophy offered, the Category shooter is eligible to shoot for Class or Place trophies. Any Category Shooter whose score does not qualify for a trophy in their category, may compete for place, or class trophies. Once declarations of Category have been made by the shooter the declaration is final and cannot be changed. There shall be no exception to this rule.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

This tournament will be governed by the rules of the Amateur Trapshooting Association. Every person who enters the competition agrees to abide by the rules of the Amateur Trapshooting Association *and* the terms of this Program *and* to accept all decisions of shoot management. Except as otherwise set out in this program, all general information, rules and regulations and safety and other information in the 2025 Calgary Shoot Program book apply to this tournament.

Grievances

Because the Provincial Championship tournament is hosted by a club, it has been unclear whether shooters with grievances should address them to the APTA or the Club. The APTA Board of Directors has therefore struck a committee consisting of the ATA Delegate and two others to be appointed by the APTA to be responsible for handling all shooter grievances at the tournament. This year's committee is Brad Johnson, Bob Gruszecki and Jim Thomson. Shooters with grievances should contact one of the committee members.

Safety

Safety should always be our number one priority. Please review and abide by the safety rules at the front of this Program and ensure that this is a safe and happy event for all.

Note Regarding Western Zone Championships

On Friday, Saturday and Sunday of this Tournament, Shooters will participate "concurrently" in both the Alberta Provincial Championships and the Western Zone Championships. ATA Rules do not permit Shooters to opt out of participation in one tournament or the other, meaning that all Shooters must pay applicable Westen Zone Fees of US\$1.50/100 targets on concurrent Western Zone Events. Given the already inflated cost of shooting, APTA was concerned that this additional expense might discourage participation in the Provincial Tournament. After considering alternatives, the APTA Board of Directors decided to pay the Western Zone Fees on behalf of all shooters competing on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.



2024 Alberta Provincial All Star Teams and High Averages

All-Star Teams are chosen based on the previous target year ATA composite averages, calculated by adding the Singles, Doubles and Handicap averages together and dividing by 3. The First Team is comprised of eligible shooters with the top five composite averages. The shooter with the highest composite average of the five is First Team Captain. The Second Team is comprised of eligible shooters with the sixth through tenth highest Composite averages. The shooter with the highest composite average of the 5 (i.e. the 6th highest composite average for the year) is the Second Team Captain.

To be eligible for the All-Star Teams, a shooter must (a) register targets at a minimum of three clubs in Alberta (no minimum number of targets per club), and (b) register a minimum of 1000 Singles, 1000 Handicap, 800 Doubles of which 500 Singles, 500 Handicap, 400 Doubles must be shot at Registered Shoots in Alberta.

Average Leaders in Singles, Doubles and Handicap are chosen based on their previous target year ATA average in the particular discipline.

To be eligible for Average Leader awards, a shooter must (a) register targets at a minimum of three clubs in Alberta (no minimum number per club), and (b) register a minimum number of targets in the particular discipline: Singles - 1000, Handicap - 1000, Doubles – 800, and in each case must be shot at Registered Shoots in Alberta.

Category Leaders are chosen based on the previous target year ATA composite averages, calculated by adding the Singles, Doubles and Handicap averages together and dividing by 3.

To be eligible for Category Leader awards: **Sub-Junior**, **Junior** and **Junior** Gold shooters must register a minimum of 500 Singles, 500 Handicap, 300 Doubles of which 300 Singles, 300 Handicap, 200 Doubles must be shot at Registered Shoots in Alberta; **Lady 1, Lady 2, Sub-Veteran**, **Veteran** and **Senior Veteran** shooters must register a minimum of 1000 Singles, 1000 Handicap, 800 Doubles of which 500 Singles, 500 Handicap, 400 Doubles must be shot at Registered Shoots in Alberta. The "three club minimum" requirement does not apply to Category shooters.
